# Web Project

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With what remains of the semester you will create a 3 page web. You should create a website that markets yourself as a candidate on the job market. In other words, create a site that describes you in a professional way. You will need your resume, a professional picture of yourself, links to anything else that you would like employers to know about you. Pretend that an employer wants you to send them your web site. The employer expects to discover what kind of skills you have, what classes you have taken, and what you have learned/studied in college. Use your resume to help you create various pages of your web site. You must have:

- 3 pages
- A navigational structure (homepage and links to all subsequent pages)
- Use relevant images/pictures/graphics
- Link to your email
- Link to a pdf version of your resume
- Write clearly and be consistent with site design (think of fonts, colors, pic size, etc.)

### Organization

**Page one** is a homepage with the navigational structure and explanation of the contents of the site (link to your email goes here). **Page two** is a page “about you” where you illustrate, describe, explain, display, who you are, your goals, and any work or assignments that represent the kind of work/research you do (your PDF resume goes on this page). **Page three** is a “reflection” page whereby you describe what you learned from doing this project and/or the class. You may also offer suggestions for future assignments or changes to current ones.
