

Academics

Students participating in this program will take a two-course combo earning a total of 6 credit hours that may be applied toward a major or minor in Spanish. These courses are highly interactive and geared towards building vocabulary, a strong grammar base, cultural awareness, and improved fluency in Spanish.

SPN 202: (Intermediate Spanish II) (3 credits) Prerequisite, SPN 201 (Intermediate Spanish I) or equivalent course, or proper placement into 202. In this course students review all grammar points studied in previous Spanish courses and continue to build vocabulary.

SPN 206: (Spanish in the Media) (3 credits). Develop listening skills and explore Spanish culture through film and television. It is fun!

Eligibility

Students are eligible to apply for this program if they meet the following eligibility criteria:

- · Degree-seeking student
- At least Sophomore standing at time of participation
- Good judicial standing
- 2.5 GPA at time of application

Cost

Estimated Program Fee: \$3,100

Program Fee includes:

- · Lodging with host families, 3 meals daily & laundry
- Hotels in double occupancy room with breakfast & dinner while on excursions
- Most ground transportation
- · Cultural excursions & activities
- Medical insurance

Additional Costs (not included in Program Fee):

- Round Trip Flight estimated at \$1,000
- Some Meals: \$100
- · Some Transportation for taxis to airport and metro while in Madrid \$50
- UNCW Tuition: for 6 credits
- · Spending money for souvenirs and/or any activities outside the program

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Federal and state financial aid may be applied toward this program. Even if you are normally ineligible for financial aid, you should submit a financial aid application (FAFSA). You may find that you are eligible for additional funding.
