### Books in our library:

- **Helen:** There are books on Helen and Greek Heroine cult as well. Other books on tragedy or on women in Greek society, or gender role in general, will have chunks of information that may be more general and useful to a 209 level class than some of the articles below.
- **Young men:** Check out works by Pierre Vidal-Naquet, especially *The Black Hunter*, and J. P. Vernant, both of whom write interestingly about initiation, with a basis in myth and drama. Also check out Walter Burkert, who has a little on initiation in Greek Religion.

### Articles

This is my selection of articles available on JSTOR, full text – there are plenty of others, but these seem to have potential. Some are older – be a little wary of anything before 1970 and read it with a mind to recognizing assumptions particularly about gender and power that may be understood differently now. Some of the articles are a little arcane for the newcomer to Greek literature, but I have included them because they speak specifically to the issues. NOTE – These are not in a standard bibliographical form, just cut and pasted from JSTOR. You aren't allowed to do this in your papers. ☺
