Medūsa, -ae f Medusa, formerly beautiful maiden turned into a snake-haired Gorgon by
Neptune's wife following an affair with him
Aethiops, Aethiōpis m an Ethiopian
Cepheus, -ī m Cepheus, king of Ethiopia
Andromeda, -ae f Cepherus' beautiful daughter
Hammon, Hammōnis m Amon, the Egyptian god; he had a trusted oracle in the Siwa
Oasis in the Sahara
