PLS 592—Seminar in Housing and Transportation Policy

Course Description: This seminar in housing and transportation policy is designed especially for those MPA students whose concentration is policy analysis and planning. The economics and politics of each of these policy areas are discussed at length and students are asked to complete 2 original field projects, one on housing and one on transportation. The broad goal is to sharpen the skills of students in analyzing and suggesting solutions to community problems in the housing and transportation areas. This is a practice oriented class although there will be some exposure to the theory underlying the dynamics of these policy areas.

Course Goals and Objectives:

To gain understanding of the dynamics of housing and transportation policy in the U.S. To gain skills in analyzing and developing solutions for housing and transportation policy in the U.S.

To prepare analyses for decision makers and "policy experts"

To further improve quantitative skills in creating indexes and using comparative data

Field Projects:

- 1. Housing Policy. Pick one community or region. Develop a demographic, social, and economic profile of the area. Identify at least 3 major housing problems in the region. Use written sources, documents from organizations and at least three interviews with "housing policy experts". For each problem document the problem and explore its causes. Pick one problem and develop at least three solutions and recommend one (give rationale). This report should be written for the "policy experts" and decision makers. 10 slide limit in your power point presentation. Turn in the slides. No paper is necessary.
- 2.Transportation Policy. Pick one community or region. Develop a demographic, social, and economic profile of the area. Identify at least 3 major transportation problems in the region. Use written sources, documents from organizations and at least three interviews with "transportation policy experts". For each problem document the problem and explore its causes. Pick one problem and develop at least three solutions and recommend one (give rationale). This report should be written for the "policy experts" and decision makers. 10 slide limit.

Case Study. Pick one successful transit or housing project completed in the last 20 years. Indicate what major factors contributed to the completion of this infrastructure. Include federal, local political, economic, and civic factors. 10 points for power point presentation.
