Course Description:

Using an African-centered philosophical worldview and a racial socialization framework, this seminar will critically examine the social and emotional effects of racism on academic, occupational, cultural and relational well being of African-American males. Students will discuss relevant readings, conduct a media analysis, critique community-based research, and share self-reflections.

In addition, students will periodically discuss topics via videoconference with the ***Psycho-educational Interactions with Black Males*** class offered by the Graduate School of Education at University of Pennsylvania.

Throughout the semester, students will be asked to develop strategies to restore a healthy definition of African-American manhood. The final project is a presentation to the class.

Choose ***Effective Interactions with African-American Males*** as an elective if you are interested in working (or likely to work) with African-American male, urban, or diverse populations.
