Article Reading Two: Interpretive Method Essay

This is an article that would be classified as qualitative research. As many authors have noted, qualitative research often makes use of multiple methods and sometimes does make use of "counting stuff" as part of providing a rich description of the issues being studied. Note how the authors make clear their theoretical position and use it as a sensitizing framework to clarify the tensions in the lives of the participants.

First, skim the entire article to get a bigger picture of what the scholar is trying to communicate. Second, read the article with the questions below in mind. Some of the questions focus on your ability to comprehend the article. Other questions address your understanding the methodological choices the author made.
