## Service Learning

## What is already in place?

- Onslow County does service learning with community partners. Examples-through the hospital—to y
- drive around Christmas time, blood drives
- Everything is done through Health Sciences Academy at the high school-goes through the director's office.
- NHCS-student groups accept proposals from other students for projects—have funding to share.
- Grants available through NC Communities in Schools for service learning. \$13,000,coming out soon.
- Juvenile Justice System-NHC and Brunswick. Project with Arboretum .

## What is needed?

- Not a real understanding in many schools of what service learning is and why it is needed. Need to understand the difference between service and service learning.
- Some universities have service learning as part of the curriculum.
- Health Academy is career-focused, curriculum embeded.
- Needs to be a recognition that service learning is a key to students at-risk for dropping out. Everything is so focused on testing. How can it be seen as a drop-out prevention strategy? How can it be valued?
- Health Academy uses recognition ceremony "white coat" for students to earn opportunity to participaate through service learning.
- Service learning as part of the curriculum with credit given for a structured course for both high and middle school.
- Building awareness that reflection is part of the learning process.
- Projects should be student-led.
- Difficult to do projects during school day. How do you connect it beyond the time meet with them in school. Blend community service with service learning.

## How do we accomplish this work together?

- Get DPI involved.
- See it as "learning through service", refocus. Connect standard course of study, end-of-grade tests into the service. Activities need to be ongoing, learners see outcome, connection to learning.
