There are 3 Subtypes of Attention Deficit/ Hyperactivity Disorder

- Predominantly inattentive type
 - Trouble paying attention, forgetful, easily distracted, selective attention
 - Students may appear lethargic, apathetic, or hypoactive (move or respond too slowly).
 - May be overlooked
- Predominantly hyperactive-impulsive type
 - Cannot seem to sit still, talk excessively, difficulty playing quietly
 - Few adolescents or adults have the HI type.
- Combined type
 - Combines features of inattention and hyperactivity
 - The majority of students with AD/HD are combined type
