
Mental Retardation Classifications

AAMR 1983 Classification	IQ Range	Educational Classification
Mild mental retardation	50–55 to 70	Educable mental retardation
Moderate mental retardation	35–40 to 50–55	Trainable mental retardation
Severe mental retardation	20–25 to 35–40	Severely/multiply handicapped
Profound mental retardation	Below 20 or 25	Severely/multiply handicapped

Formula for determining IQ

$$IQ = \underbrace{MA}_{CA} X \quad 100$$
