



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LETS MAKE A TIMELINE OF

THE PRESIDENCIES OF JEFFERSON AND MADISON

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In February the Supreme Court heard the case of Marbury v. Madison. Chief Justice Marshall wrote the Court's decision in which judicial review was established.

In October, the Senate ratified the treaty in which the United States took control of new lands west of the Mississippi through the Louisiana Purchase.

Some younger men from the southern and western states who were in favor of war with the indians and thus known as the *War Hawks* were elected to Congress in November 1811.

Louis and Clark reached the Pacific Ocean after starting up the Missouri River from St. Louis on a two year journey in which they mapped and studied the newly acquired Louisiana Purchase.

Because the Embargo Act was hurting New England merchants and they protested strongly, Congress replaced it with the Nonintercourse Act which allowed Americans to trade with all nations except Britain and France.

James Madison took office after Jefferson and was eventually forced into the War of 1812 even though the nation was unprepared and the Federalists in the House would vote no.

The United States ended the war with Tripoli in 1815 by getting the ruler to sign a treaty promising to let American ships alone without the payment of a bribe.

Aaron Burr fatally wounded Alexander Hamilton in a duel after Hamilton declared Burr was not to be trusted with the reins of government when he heard of a scheme to make New York and New Jersey an independent confederacy.

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The United States frigate Chesapeake was attacked, boarded and had four alleged deserters taken and impressed into service in the British Navy but Jefferson was able to avoid war.
