<p><b>13:54</b> He came to his hometown and began to teach the people in their synagogue, so that they were astounded and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these deeds of power?"</p>	<p><b>6:1</b> He left that place and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him.  <b>6:2</b> On the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands!"</p>
<p><b>13:55</b> Is not this <u>the carpenter's son?</u> <u>Is not his mother called Mary?</u> And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? <b>13:56</b> And are not all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all this?"</p>	<p><b>6:3</b> Is not this <u>the carpenter,</u> <u>the son of Mary</u> and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?"</p>
<p><b>13:57</b> And they took offense at him. But Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor except in their own country and in their own house."</p>	<p>And they took offense at him.  <b>6:4</b> Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, <u>and among their own kin,</u> and in their own house."</p>
<p><b>13:58</b> And <u>he did not do many deeds of power there,</u> because of their unbelief.</p>	<p><b>6:5</b> And <u>he could do no deed of power there,</u> except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. <b>6:6</b> And he was amazed at their unbelief.</p>
