## Perfect tense

- Begin with the third principle part. (ex.: amavi, vidi)
- Drop the –i to get the perfect stem. (amav-, vid-)
- You do not have to worry about the correct vowel because the vowel is built into the perfect ending and does not change.

• Add the perfect endings:
