## **Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences**

#### **Nominative:**

#### **Endings**

1 <sup>st</sup> sing.	1 <sup>st</sup> pl.	2 <sup>nd</sup> sing.	2 <sup>nd</sup> . pl.	
-a	-ae	-er/ -us	-Ī	
rosa	rosae	puer/amicus	pueri	

#### Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences

**USE:** Shows that the word is the SUBJECT of the sentence or a word describing the subject.

- **puer amicos vocat,** the boy calls his friends.
- <u>amicus</u> pueros vocat, the friend calls the boys.
- nautas <u>pueri</u> vocant, the boys call the sailors.

#### Genitive:

#### Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences

SPECIAL MEANING: "OF" or "'s" or "s"

- **amicus pueri** = the <u>boy's</u> friend or the friend <u>of the boy</u>
- **puerorum ager** = the <u>boys'</u> field or the field <u>of the boys</u>
- **filius agricolae** = the son of the farmer or the farmer's son.

#### **Accusative:**

#### Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences

**USE:** shows that the word is the direct object or the objkect of a preposition.

- **pueri agricolas vocant,** the boys call the farmers.
- **agricoale famam poetarum laudant,** the farmers pariase the fame of the poets.
- pueri puellas amant, the boys love the girls.

#### Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences

BOTH: USE: Indirect object USUALLY TRANSLATED "to" or "for"

- **puer puellae rosas dat**, the boy gioves flowers to the girl (or, the boy gives the girl flowers)
- nauta <u>agricolis</u> pecuniam dat, the sailor gives money <u>to the farmers</u> (or, the sailor gives <u>the farmers</u> money)

#### Special Meanings VS. Uses in Sentences

**USE:** Object of prepositions

- **sine amicis errat** , he wanders without <u>his friends</u>.
- **de fama cogitat**, he thinks about fame.
- in agro laborat, he works in the field.

#### **Prepositional Phrases**

**Prepositions are words that show relationships:** (in, near, about, from, under, over, with, without ...) (in, prope, de, ex, sub, super, cum, sine)

# Prepositions are always part of a prepositional phrase that also contains a noun they "govern"

- about the girl de puella
- without my friend sine amico
- in the house in casa
- in the field in agro

#### In Latin the case of the noun the preposition governs changes to show the relationship

- The case it changes to will always be ablative or accusative
- Which one depends on the preposition

#### **Ablative:**

in, sine, sub, cum

- 9. Today you have much fame in your country.
