- **Changes** (change the following nominative nouns into the ablative case, accusative case, whatever; change the following verbs into the future tense, etc.)
- **Uses:** Things like:
 - identifying direct objects and translating sentences
 - translating phrases with genitives
 - multiple choice questions testing things like adjective agreement, objects of prepositions, verb agreement, using commands and infinitives, which case to use, etc.
