Apollō, Apollinis, m Apollo (youthful god of prophecy, poetry, and medicine)
Minerva, -ae f Minerva (goddess of wisdom, helper of heroes)

Graeae, -ārum, f pl the Graeae, three prophetic old women who share an eye and a tooth
Gorgon, Gorgōnis f a Gorgon
Medūsa, -ae f Medusa, formerly beautiful maiden turned into a snake-haired Gorgon by
Neptune's wife following an affair with him
Aethiops, Aethiōpis m an Ethiopian
Cepheus, ī m Cepheus, king of Ethiopia
Andromeda, -ae f Cepheus' beautiful daughter
Hammon, Hammōnis m Amon, the Egyptian god; he had a trusted oracle in the Siwa
Oasis in the Sahara
