Forms:

- singular: cui
- plural: quibus

Meaning: Indirect objects; to/for whom

dō, tradō, dicō, narrō, nuntiō, monstrō, ostendō

- puella cui rosās dabam The girl to whom I gave roses...
- puellae quibus rosās damus The girls to whom I gave roses...
- puerī quibus omnia narrāmus The boys to whom we told everything...
- amīcōs quibus cōsīlium dīximus The friends to whom we spoke our plan ...
- auditor cui versūs recitō The listener to whom I am reciting verses ...

Genitive:

Forms:

- singular: cuius
- plural: quōrum, quārum

Meaning: whose, of whom

- puer cuius mātrem cognōscō The boy whose mother I know ...
- puella cuius mātrem cognōscō The girl whose mother I know ...
- puellas quārum mātrem cognōscō The girls whose mother I know ...
- pueros quōrum mātrem cognōscō The boys whose mother I know ...
- senex cuius filius mē amat the old man whose son loves me ...
- senem cuius filius mē amat the old man whose son loves me ...
- senēs quōrum verba acria audiō The old men whose sharp words I hear ...
- amīcās quārum verba dulcia dēligō The friends whose sweet words I hear ...

Ablative:

with preposition (now) or special meanings (later)

Forms:

	<i>masculine</i>	<i>feminine</i>	<i>neuter</i>
<i>singular</i>	quō	quā	quō
<i>plural</i>	quibus	quibus	quibus

Examples

- casa ē quā fugiō The house from which I am fleeing ...
- casae in quibus manēbāmus The houses in which we stayed ...

- **virum dē quō dicēmus** the man about whom we will speak ...
- **templum dē quō fugimus** The temple from which we are fleeing ...
- **mensās in quibus stili iacent** The ables in which the writing instruments are lying ...
- **liber ā quō multum discimus** The book from which we learn a lot ...
