<b>bibo</b> bibere bibi bibitum	to drink , drink in
<b>edo</b> edere or esse edi esum	to eat , devour, consume, waste
<b>relinquo</b> -linquere -liqui -lictum	to leave behind
<b>orbis</b> -is m.	a circle , ring, disk; orbit
<b>sinus</b> -us m.	a curve , fold, winding; a fold, pocket, lap
<b>iaceo</b> iacere iacui	to lie , be situated; to lie low, lie flat
<b>plenus</b> -a -um	full , full of (with genit. or abl.)
<b>maestus</b> -a -um	sad , dejected, gloomy
<b>claudio</b> claudere clausi clausum	to close , shut up, make inaccessible
<b>res rei</b> f.	a thing , object, matter, affair, circumstance
<b>pomum</b> -i n.	any kind of fruit; a fruit tree
<b>lego</b> legere legi lectum	to collect , gather, pick, pick up
<b>tempero</b> -are intransit.	to be moderate , control oneself
<b>genitor</b> -oris m.	a begetter , father, producer
<b>poena</b> -ae f.	money paid as atonement , a fine; in gen. punishment, penalty; loss, hardship
<b>mors mortis</b> f.	death , a corpse; a cause of death or destruction
<b>vita</b> -ae f.	life
