- 5. matres nos monuerunt ne cum igne luderemus. *Our mothers warned us not to play with fire.*
- 6. Catullus petīvit ā Lesbia ut eum amāret. Catullus sought from Lesbia that she would always love him.
- 7. quaerō ab amīcīs ut mihi benigē respondeant. *I ask from my friends that they answer me kindly.*
- 8. servos hortatur ut semper dominum pareant. He urged the slaves to always obey their master.
