Present:

Why doesn't your mother like me? (Lit. why am I not pleasing to your mother?)

cūr nōn placeō mātri tuae?

Why do you prepare such disgusting dinners? **cūr cēnās tam foedās parās?**

Why do you bathe so often? **Cūr tam frequenter tē lavās?**

How can you say that to me? **quōmodō haec mihi dicere potes?**

Where is my money? **Ubi est pecūnia mea?**

Past:

Why did your father come here yesterday? **cūr hērī pater tuus ibi vēnit?**

Who was that man with you by the fountain house yesterday? **Quī vir erat tēcum prope fontem hērī?**

Where did your friend Claudia come from? **Unde vēnit amīca tua Claudia?**

Future:

When will your evil mother visit us again? **Quandō mater tua imprōba nōs iterum visitābit?**

How awful that will be! **Quam dirum erit!**

(these are done with past tense main verbs at the end.)

Present:

Why do you never work all day in the fields? **Cūr numquam tōtum diem in agrīs labōrās?**

Why do you always talk to other women? **Cūr semper cum aliīs fēminīs colloquium habēs?**

Why are you always with your friends at the taverna? **Cūr es semper cum amīcīs tuīs in tabernā?**

Do you love your children? **liberōsne amās?**

Past:

Where did you go two days ago? **Quō vēnistī abhinc duōs diēs?**

What woman were you with at the games? **Cum quā fēminā erās ad lūdōs?**

After I made you dinner, where did you go? **Postquam tibi cēnam parāvī, quō vēnistī?**

How many women have you loved after we got married? **Quantās fēminās amāvistī postquam mē in matrimōnium dūxistī?**

Future:

When will you become a better husband? **Quandō fiēs marītus melior?**

How will I live with such a cruel man! **Quōmodō cum virō tam crudēlī vivam?**

Situation 1: Primary tenses: One neighbor is standing outside the window as the fight is going on, telling her friend over her shoulder what the arguing couple is saying.

- **Same time: present subj.**
- **Previously: perf. subj.**
- **Future: fake future 1:** -urus, -a, -um plus sim, sis, sit etc.

Situation 2: Past tenses: One neighbor is telling another about the fight a week after it happened.

- **Same time: imperfect subj.**
- **Previously: pluperfect subj.**
- **Future: fake future 2:** -urus, -a, -um + essem, esses, esset etc.

(**Situation 2: Past tenses:** One neighbor is telling another about the fight a week after it happened.

- **Same time: imperfect subj.**
- **Previously: pluperfect subj.**
- **Future: fake future 2:** -urus, -a, -um + essem, esses, esset etc.)

NOTE: we are changing “I/you/my/your” etc. into “he/she/his/her etc.

Present:

He asked why she prepared such disgusting dinners.

ille rōgāvit cūr cēnās tam foedās parāret?

He asked why she bathed so often. **ille rōgāvit cūr tam frequenter sē lavāret?**

He asked how she could say that to him. **ille rōgāvit quōmodō haec ei dicere posset?**

He asked where his money was. **ille rōgāvit ubi esset pecūnia eius?**

Past:

He asked why her father came here yesterday. **ille rōgāvit cūr hērī pater tuus ibi vēnisset?**

He asked what man was with her by the fountain house yesterday. **ille rōgāvit quī vir fuisset**

cum ei prope fontem hērī?

He asked where her friend Claudia had come from. **ille rōgāvit unde vēnisset amīca eius**

Future:

He asked when her evil mother would visit them again. **ille rōgāvit quāndō mater eius imprōba eōs iterum visitātura esset?**

He exclaimed How awful that would be! **ille clamavit quam dīrum futurum esset!**
