AMBIGUOUS RELATIONSHIP

PREDICTORS OF COHABITATION EFFECT

- **SELECTION**—THE PRE-EXISTING CHARACTERISTICS OF THOSE WHO LIVE TOGETHER
- **EXPERIENCE**—COMMUNICATION EVENTS THAT OCCUR WHILE LIVING TOGETHER THAT ERODE THE MOTIVATION FOR AND/OR COMMITMENT TO MARRIAGE

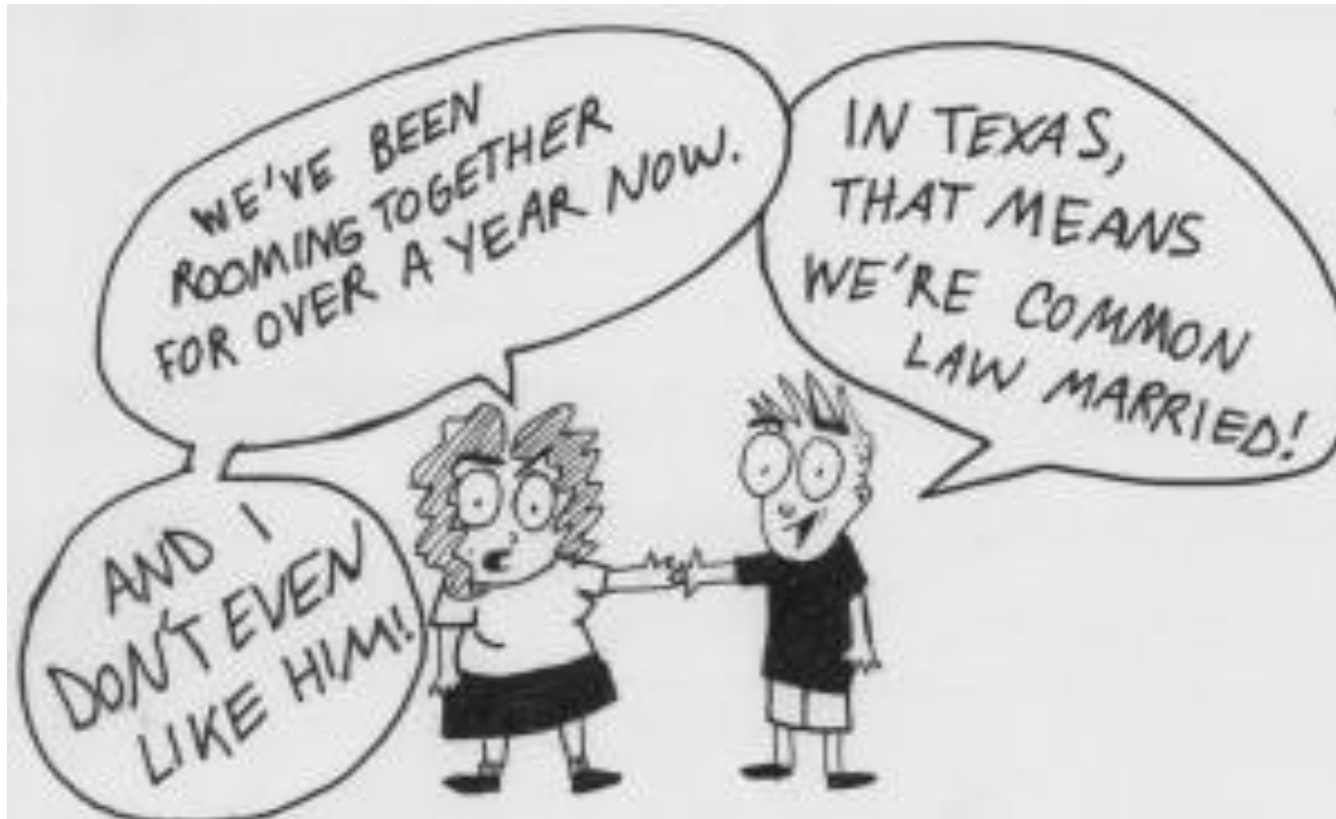
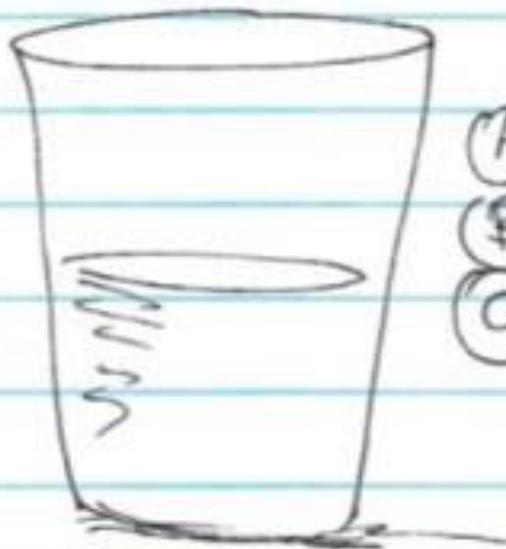

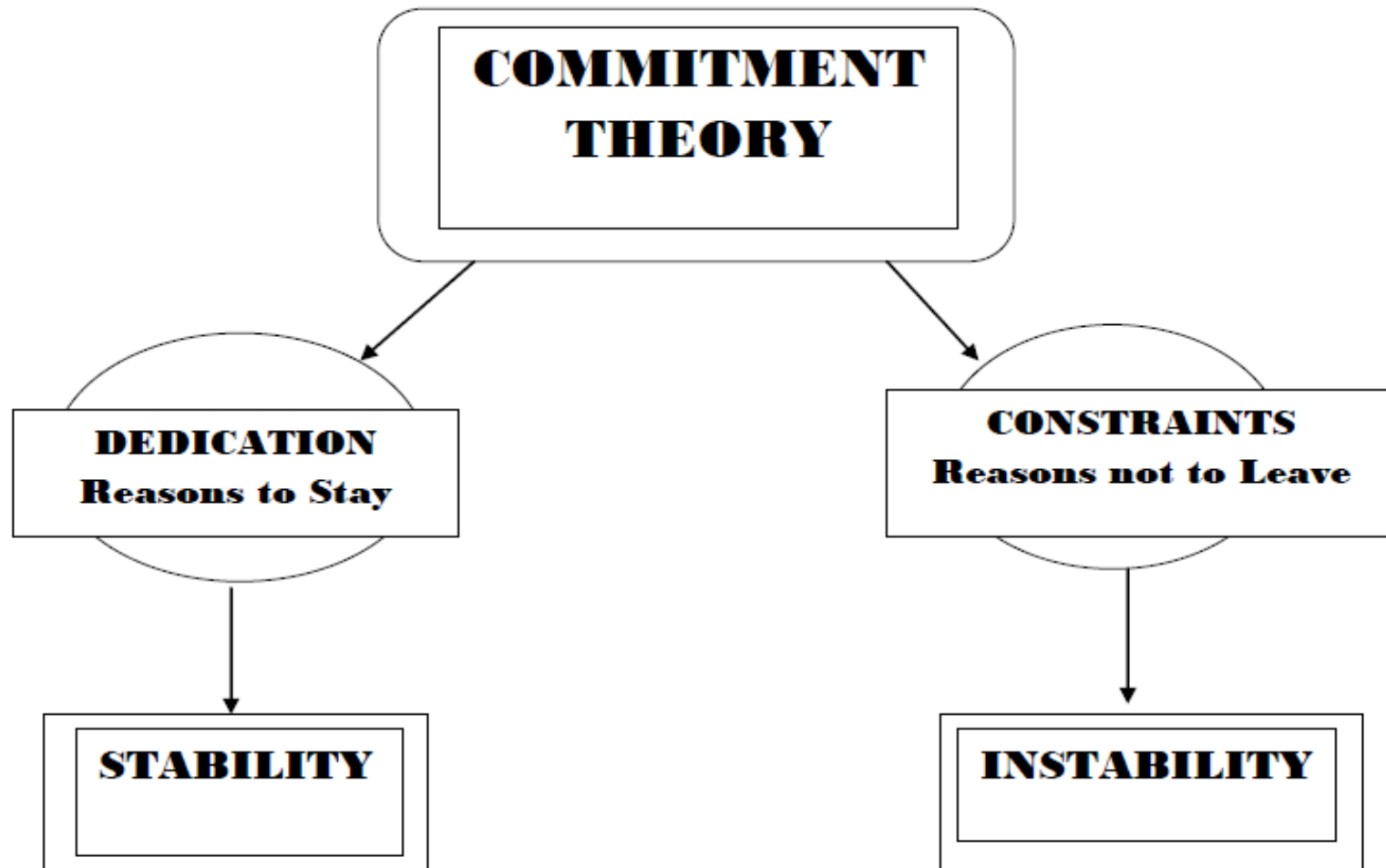

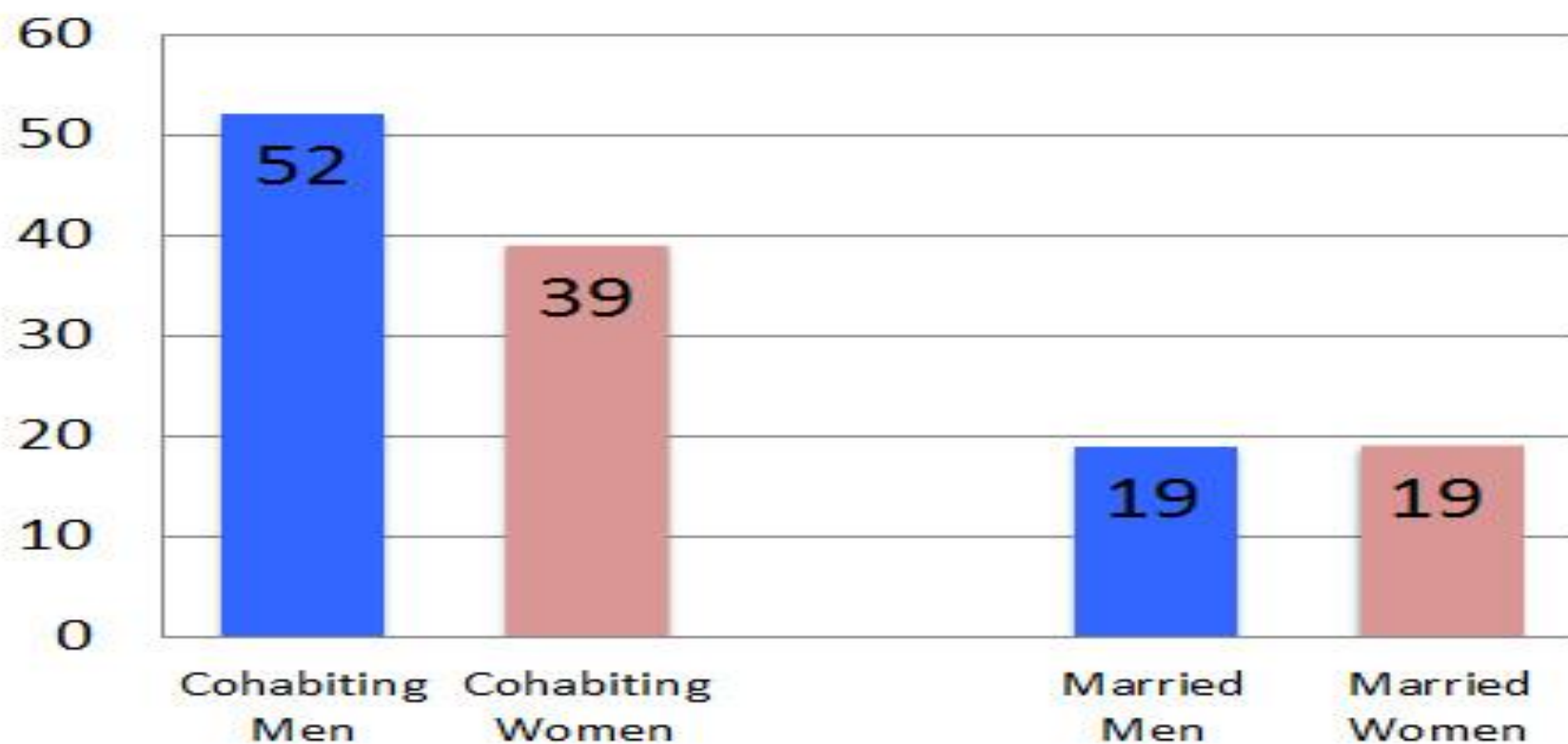
